

Course grades will be based on class discussion (10%) and two written assignments: an 8-10 page ("conference length") essay applying concepts from the course to a literary or cultural text (40%) and an expanded 20-25 page ("article length") revision of the essay (50%).

Attendance: Ideally, you will attend all class sessions. If you miss more than one class, you will fail the course. This policy also applies to auditors.

Course purpose: This seminar will survey the work of Slavoj Zizek as a seminal theoretical voice in the continuing development of both Lacanian psychoanalytic interpretation and cultural materialist analyses as well as in the elaboration of connections and disconnections between the two schools of thought. We will also submit the public persona(s) of Zizek himself to a Zizekian critique, attempting to unravel his complex self-presentation as, among other things, political gadfly, intellectual celebrity, and popular culture critic.
